



Record 5 – Rental/ Short-Term Grazing and Forage Agreement (Nitrates Regulations¹) 2025

Important Information

- Record 5's submitted for the purposes of movement of animals will not be accepted and will be returned unprocessed by the Department.
- Where the agreement is based on the movement of animals, a Record 4 must be completed.
- Record 5 is based on the rental of land taken for forage ((i.e. silage/hay) and/or grazing where land will be under your control for the specified period).
- Record 5 can only be considered as part of a whole farm nitrates stocking rate calculation.
- Land declared on a record 5 in 2025 will not be accounted for in a holding's overall grassland stocking rate calculation.
 - *The amended Nitrates Regulations (S.I. 42 of 2025) defines that the grassland area will only be based on the eligible grassland area as submitted to the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine for Direct Payments for the year in question.*
- Land that is already designated as ANC on the BISS application will be deemed ineligible on a record 5.
- Deadline for submission of Record 5 is 31st December 2025.

- The only acceptable proof of postage will be Express Post or Registered Post Receipt.
- The owner of the holding is responsible for ensuring that a copy of the completed Record 5 is submitted to Nitrates Section by the above deadline.

Information specific to the personal data being collected by Nitrates Division

The following data is specific information in relation to the personal data processed for the purposes of ensuring compliance with the Nitrates Regulations. Compliance with the Nitrates Regulations is also in the Terms & Conditions for the Basic Income Support for Sustainability.

Specified purpose

The personal data sought from you, or previously furnished by you, is required for the purpose of complying with the Nitrates Regulations, audit, evaluation purposes, conditionality controls, controls relating to the legislation underpinning relevant CSP schemes, conditionality and all Rural Development measures, Also, personal information may be released under S.I. 628 of 2023 EUROPEAN UNION (CAP STRATEGIC PLAN, information sharing) Regulation 2023 and under the terms of the relevant Data Protection legislation in force, the European Communities (Access to Information on the Environment) Regulations 2007 to 2018 and the Freedom of Information Act 2014. Failure to provide all the personal data required to facilitate the processing of the application; including data testing, under the scheme will result in DAFM being unable to further process the application. Failure to provide certain information which you are required to provide under the Terms and Conditions of the schemes may result in the necessity to repay monies already paid under the schemes, or in sanctions being applied under these schemes. You should consult the Terms & Conditions and Specification of the schemes in this regard.

Sanctions for failure to comply with the Nitrates Regulations (SI 113 OF 2022, as amended) are provided for in the CAP EU Regulations, including Regulations (EU) 2021/2115 and 2021/2116 of the European Parliament and of the Council as well as relevant secondary legislation, and are applied under the Terms and Conditions of the Basic Income Support for Sustainability (BISS), CAP Strategic plan (CSP) and Rural Development Measures.

The Department may also use data provided for the purposes of facilitating the processing of an application for participation in other related schemes operated by the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine or for the purposes of updating information on the relevant databases held by the Department in connection with these schemes. Each scheme has its own legal basis as outlined under their own Terms and Conditions.

Legal basis

The current legislation for Data Protection in Ireland is the Data Protection Act 1988 as amended by the 2003 Data Protection Act, The Data Protection Act 2018, the Data Sharing & Governance Act 2019 and The General Data Protection Regulations (EU 2016/679).

Recipients & Data Sharing

Information provided to Nitrates Division will be shared, with other Divisions within the Department, for the purposes of processing other related scheme applications in a timely and efficient manner. This sharing shall be done in compliance with the CSP legislative framework and relevant data protection legislation.

Personal data may also be sought from and made available to other Government Departments/Agencies/Local Authorities/contracted parties/LIFE Projects, but only where there is a valid legal basis to do so. Anonymised data may also be shared between public bodies to support the achievement of government objectives.

Where appropriate, a Data Sharing Agreement will be put in place. The purpose of this sharing of data is to facilitate, among other things, the fulfilment of the obligations placed on Member States and objectives of the CSP. This includes, but is not limited to management, control and audit purposes, monitoring and evaluation purposes, Conditionality controls, controls relating to the legislation underpinning Conditionality, CSP and all Rural Development measures, as required by Regulation (EU) No. 2021/2116 of the European Parliament and the Council and for the performance of the CAP Strategic Plan as required by Article 128 of Regulation (EU) No. 2021/2115 of the European Parliament and of the Council. Data sharing for the purposes of the CAP Strategic Plan is allowed for under S.I. 628 of 2023 EUROPEAN UNION (CAP STRATEGIC PLAN, information sharing) Regulation 2023. Also, personal data may be released as required by relevant Data Protection legislation and the Freedom of Information Act 2014.

Personal data may be used for, among other things, statistical, research and analysis purposes in some circumstances, but will only be done so in compliance with the Data Protection legislation and the legislative measures under the CSP. Data used for such purposes will be anonymised, as appropriate, to protect to the security and confidentiality of the data. The use of the data in this way may facilitate the Department in informing policy decisions into the future, which would benefit the Irish farmer and the Agriculture Sector.

The Department is also currently obliged by law to provide information concerning applicants in response to requests received from the Office of the Revenue Commissioners, An Garda Síochana, and other bodies and this will take place in accordance with Data Protection legislation.

As part of this scheme, if approved into the scheme, you may be requested by the Department or relevant agents acting on its behalf, to supply data in relation to your participation to this Scheme, and facilitate on-farm inspections/assessments, where required for the purpose of assessment, verification, evaluation or research purposes as provided for under the CSP Regulations (e.g., EU Regulation 2021/2115 and EU Regulation 2021/2116 and S.I. 113 of 2022 (as amended)). Not to supply such information may invalidate/cancel your application or incur sanctions under those schemes.

Transferred outside the EU

Information provided in relation to the Nitrates Regulations is not currently transmitted outside of the EU.

Retention Period

The data submitted in support of the application by the data subject will be retained by the Department only as long as there is a business need to do so in line with the purposes for which it was collected.

Data provision being statutory or contractual obligation:

The data provided for this purpose is being requested on a statutory basis under the Nitrates Regulations (SI. 113 of 2022, as amended) and EU legislation.

Automated Decision Making:

Personal data provided to Nitrates Division will be processed automatically for the purpose of the efficient running of the scheme.

Automated decision making will also be used for the purposes of selecting participants for inspection in accordance with the regulations and for the performance of the CAP Strategic Plan as required by Regulation

(EU) 2021/2115 of the European Parliament, EU Regulation 2021/2116, Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) No. 2022/1173 and SI. 113 of 2022 (as amended).

Information from Third Party:

Your personal data in relation to Nitrates records may be obtained from another party that submits information to Nitrates & Biodiversity Division, this includes (but is not exhaustive) for example in a declaration submitted by them of a transaction regarding the movement of livestock manure, the temporary movement of animals or the short term rental of land in line with this Department's requirement to ensure compliance with the Nitrates Regulations and associated legislation. In circumstances where this Department did not gather your personal data you are still entitled to exercise your rights in relation to this personal data and the details on how to exercise individuals rights are detailed
